

Your 2024-2025 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for a process called verification. The law states that colleges must verify the information you and your parent(s) report on the FAFSA before federal student aid is disbursed. To verify that you provided correct information, financial aid administrators will compare your FAFSA with the information on this worksheet and with any other required documents. If there are differences, your FAFSA information may need corrections and could affect the student federal eligibility. You and at least one parent who filed your FAFSA must submit this completed signed worksheet with any required documents to the Colorado College Financial Aid Office. We may ask for additional information. If you do not have a copy of the filed tax return a 2022 IRS Tax Return Transcript may be obtained through:

- Get Transcript by Mail – Go to www.irs.gov, click "Get Your Tax Record." Click "Get Transcript by Mail." Make sure to request the "Return Transcript" and *NOT* the "Account Transcript." The transcript is generally received within 10 business days from the IRS's receipt of the online request.
- Get Transcript Online – Go to www.irs.gov, click "Get Your Tax Record." Click "Get Transcript Online." Make sure to request the "Return Transcript" and *NOT* the "Account Transcript." To use the Get Transcript Online tool, the user must have (1) access to a valid email address, (2) a text-enabled mobile phone (pay-as-you-go plans cannot be used) in the user's name, and (3) specific financial account numbers (such as a credit card number or an account number for a home mortgage or auto loan). The transcript displays online upon successful completion of the IRS's two-step authentication.
- Automated Telephone Request – 1-800-908-9946. Transcript is generally received within 10 business days from the IRS's receipt of the telephone request.
- Paper Request Form – IRS Form 4506T-EZ or IRS Form 4506-T. The transcript is generally received within 10 business days from the IRS's receipt of the paper request form.
