Space Utilization Study (FY24)

- 1. Space Capacity
 - Assigned Squared Footage Available vs.
 Needed (per functional area)
- 2. Space Usage
 - Redefining where offices and programs should go
 - Rightsizing classroom and office spaces; and scheduling
- 3. Space Governance
 - Structure, policies and processes, and technology



Select Action Items

- 1. Place similar functional areas into appropriate spaces (example: academic depts in academic buildings)
- 2. Relocate student services from the east to the center of campus
 - Better utilize the Library (and adjacencies) to house student services
 - Use Armstrong Hall to house more student services



Space Governance Operational Group

Charge: The Space Governance Operational Group (SGOG) is charged with implementing space management strategies, policies, and practices to support efficient and effective use and stewardship of physical assets, anticipate future space needs, and respond to college priorities.

Members include: Accessibility, Campus Safety, Dean of the Faculty Office, Facilities, FEC Representative, Finance, ITS Registrar, Student Life Housing

Goals for AY 25- 26: Launch the Space Request Process Pilot and establish the Standardized Space Data Subgroup.



Space Request Process (Pilot)

- Recommendation 2: Space Usage
 - Space request pilot process
 - Intended outcomes include:
 - Identifying recurring space-related needs and challenges
 - Evaluating and informing the creation of clear policies and prioritization criteria
 - Revealing policy gaps.
 - Promoting transparency, consistency, and equity in spacerelated decision-making



Scope of the Pilot

Included:

- Single Office moves
- Single department moves
- Renovation/modernization of an existing space (e.g. change lighting, carpet, and paint. Add a door)
- Changes in space use type (e.g. change a classroom to multiple offices)

Not included:

- New hire faculty space
- Multi-office or department relocations
- New construction
- Full building renovations



Process Overview

- Discuss with your Director/Dean and VP to ensure alignment and support
- Complete the space request form located at <u>https://www.coloradocollege.edu/other/opgov/space-request-process.html</u>
 - Fall review: Requests submitted by end of Block 1 (Block 2 for pilot year), response by end of Block 2 (Block 3 pilot year)
 - Spring review: Requests submitted by end of Block 5, response by end of Block 6




Decision Pathway

- Space Governance Operational Group (SGOG) is a recommending body.
- Requests reviewed and a recommendation is submitted by SGOG to the Chief Operating Officer (COO) for final consideration.
- Depending on scope and impact cabinet members and president may be consulted before a final decision is made.




Freedom of Expression: Policy Review Process




Banner Self-Service Upgrade



Employee Dashboard


Dashboardbased interface






