Cruise during the peak of spring, with long days of bright green scenery speckled with blooming flowers and rushing waterfalls from snow melting in the mountains.

This varied and balanced itinerary combines the wonders of the natural world with the historical and cultural highlights of the area. Our cruise is bookended with time in some of the region's most remote and inaccessible island groups—Scotland's **Orkney Islands** and Norway's **Lofoten Islands**—and offers **rich opportunities for bird- and whale watching**. Furthermore, this itinerary provides several days inside **Norway's iconic fjords**, including the awe-inspiring **Sognefjord**, Norway's longest, as well as the UNESCO-listed **Nærøyfjord**.

Step ashore at peaceful, picturesque fjord-side towns and fishing villages off the beaten track—splendid Art Nouveau **Ålesund**, set on myriad islands stretching out into the ocean; **Brønnøysund**, from which one can access **Torghatten**, a granite mountain that is a famed landmark of the Norwegian coast; and such tiny villages as **Å**, **Reine**, or **Nusfjord** in the Lofotens—all of which have inspired artists and photographers for over a century. A **pre-cruise extension** in Edinburgh and the Scottish Highlands, and a **post-cruise extension** in Oslo are also available.

Professor Bull will be part of a **team of onboard experts** who together will offer a **series of lectures and informal discussions**. Along the way, you will delight in cruising for **eight nights aboard the elegantly appointed and newly renovated** *Exploris One*, designed to safely navigate demanding waters while offering the highest level of service and comfort. Each of her **72 suites and spacious staterooms** offers breathtaking ocean views, some with private balconies.

Saturday and Sunday, May 30 and 31 DEPART HOME / INVERNESS, SCOTLAND

Depart home on overnight flights to Inverness. Upon arrival on May 31st, relax before meeting your fellow travelers at a welcome dinner. DORNOCH STATION (D)

Monday, June 1

INVERNESS / EMBARK EXPLORIS ONE

Explore Inverness Old Town and its indoor Victorian market, with lunch on your own during free time in town before embarking *Exploris One* this afternoon. *EXPLORIS ONE* (B.D)

Tuesday, June 2 KIRKWALL, ORKNEY ISLANDS

Disembark in Kirkwall for a morning exploration of the Ring of Brodgar and Skara Brae, part of the UNESCO "Heart of Neolithic Orkney," the most important Neolithic sites in western Europe. Return to the ship for lunch and then set out on one of two afternoon options: **1.** Take a guided tour of Kirkwall, including the medieval St. Magnus Cathedral, with free time in the vibrant and pretty downtown; or **2.** Visit The Quoy of Houton, listed as one of the top 10 UK coastal gardens, with the owner, a renowned horticulturalist, before returning to the ship. *EXPLORIS ONE* (B,L,D)

Wednesday, June 3

AT SEA / SOGNEFJORD, NORWAY

Enjoy a full day at sea looking for wildlife from one of the ship's spacious decks, indulging in the ship's amenities, and listening to lectures from our team of experts. As evening approaches, arrive at the entrance of Sognefjord, Norway's longest and deepest fjord. *EXPLORIS ONE* (B,L,D)

Thursday, June 4 VIK AND NÆRØYFJORD

Join a private cruise of the UNESCO World Heritage-listed Nærøyfjord, narrowest and best known of the many arms of the Sognefjord. This fjord stands out as Norway's premier natural wonder, boasting steep mountainsides, hanging valleys, majestic peaks, snowfields, cascading waterfalls, and quaint hamlets. Visit one such hamlet, Gudvagen, a historic Viking village nestled deep within Nærøyfjord, where there is free time to explore independently. Also discover the riches of Vik, a picturesque village along the banks of the Sognefjord, including the impressive Hopperstad Stave Church, one of Norway's 28 remaining stave churches and the oldest in the country. And don't miss the opportunity to sample the local 'gamalost cheese;' see Moahaugane Burial Mounds, dating back to A.D. 200; or walk the grounds of Djupvik, a unique LOFOTEN ISLANDS mythological garden. Friday, June 5 AT SEA / NORDFJORDEID

Enjoy a morning at sea with time for lectures before arriving in Nordfjordeid. Be welcomed by a stunning coastline, majestic mountains and valleys, expansive farmland, and a chance to see the mighty Nordfjordeid

Briksdal Glacier, the largest in Europe. Here, choose from various excursion options including kayaking and a guided hike to learn about the local ecosystem, driving to see the Briksdal Glacier and walk the Loen Skylift, or visiting with a local family in their private home to learn about the Norwegian way of life and culture followed by a trip to the Norwegian Fjord Horse Center. *EXPLORIS ONE* (B,L,D)

Saturday, June 6 RUNDE AND ÅLESUND / AT SEA

Get up early this morning to look for birds on the cliffs at Runde, a nesting site of over 240 species including puffins, followed by a visit to beautiful Ålesund. Known for its Art Nouveau buildings and islands stretching out into the ocean, Ålesund offers three optional excursions including:

 The medieval village of Sumøre, an open-air museum;
 Viking's Island; or
 An in-depth city walk including Mt. Aksla, followed by free time. In the afternoon, enjoy cruising with time for lectures, relaxing on board, and keeping an eye out for whales. *EXPLORIS ONE* (B,L,D)

Sunday, June 7 AT SEA / TORGHATTEN AND BRØNNØYSUND

Continue cruising north this morning, with time for lectures. After lunch, arrive at the coastal town of Brønnøysund to delve into its history and culture, surrounded by natural landscapes. Choose from optional excursions: **1.** Hike Torghatten, known for its mythical mountain with a distinctive hole through it; **2.** Enjoy a panoramic drive and visit Hildur's Farm for a taste of Norwegian farm life; or **3.** Explore Norwegian aquaculture at the Norwegian Aquaculture Center. Reboard in the late afternoon and depart for the Lofoten Islands, crossing the Arctic Circle along the way. *EXPLORIS ONE* (B,L,D)

Monday, June 8 REINE (LOFOTEN ISLANDS)

Enjoy a full day exploring the picturesque Lofoten Islands, where you will visit charming fishing villages such as Å, Reine, or Nusfjord, each offering unique insights into local life. Discover the rich Viking heritage at the Lofotr Viking Museum, home to the world's largest Viking longhouse, and visit a local farm indulging in a lunch ashore where you will learn about the islands' efforts in sustainable farming. Conclude the day with the Captain's farewell reception and dinner. *EXPLORIS ONE* (B,L,R,D)

Tuesday, June 9 DISEMBARK / HOME

Transfer to Bodø airport. Alternatively, those with late flights may take an optional morning tour in Bodø, or you may begin the optional post-voyage extension. (B)

PRE-VOYAGE May 27-31, 2026 EDINBURGH AND THE SCOTTISH HIGHLANDS

Fly from home to Edinburgh, Scotland. Spend the next few days exploring the highlights of Edinburgh and the Scottish Highlands. Enjoy two nights at *Cheval Old Town Chambers*, located in Edinburgh's Old Town, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Continue with a private tasting and tour at one of Scotland's top malt whisky distilleries. Unwind with a night at *Dornoch Station* and, if desired, play a round at the historic Royal Dornoch Golf Club—advance tee time reservations are strongly recommended.

POST-VOYAGE June 9-12, 2026 ART AND GARDENS OF OSLO

After exploring Bodø, fly to Oslo for a three-night stay at the elegant and historic *Grand Hotel*, opened in 1874, and for over 140 years the host to international guests, world leaders, celebrities, and the Nobel Peace Prize laureates. Highlights include the Vigeland Sculpture Park, the world's largest sculpture park created by a single artist, Gustav Vigeland, featuring more than 200 of his works in bronze, granite, and wrought iron; and the Fram Museum of Polar Exploration, which artfully narrates the story of Norwegian polar exploration.

Previously known as the *Silver Explorer* and owned by Silversea Cruises, *Exploris One* began her new life with French company Exploris Expeditions after a full renovation in 2023. Having known this vessel for many years, we know her to be ideal for small ship cruising. Her shallow draft allows us to access remote areas larger ships cannot reach, and guests enjoy spacious deck areas perfect for spotting wildlife and soaking in the scenery. *Exploris One* combines adventure with exceptional comfort, including two elevators connecting all passenger decks. All 60 staterooms and 12 suites are outside and finished to high standards. Le Grand Restaurant offers refined French and international cuisine. The Grand Salon and Panoramic Lounge provide breathtaking views. Onboard amenities include a conference room for lectures, complimentary Wi-Fi (intermittent), hair salon, fitness center, massage room, sauna, and two hot tubs.

WHAT TO EXPECT This is a moderately strenuous program, at times physically demanding and busy, with considerable walking at some sites. Hiking options are available in some ports, with distances of up to three miles. In some instances, elevators are unavailable, and stairs may not have handrails. You will need to climb into and out of Zodiacs for several excursions ashore-and there may be additional use of the Zodiacs to take advantage of opportunities that arise. Participants should be fit and in active good health. Limited medical facilities are available on board Exploris One. All participants will be required to follow safety protocols set forth by Eos Study Tours/ Colorado College Tiger Travel or Criterion Travel, local staff, and host country laws. If the tour manager decides that a participant cannot visit a site safely or in a timely manner, their judgment will be final. Where possible, an alternate activity may be suggested; additional costs may apply.

GROUP SIZE This program can accommodate 114 participants, including travelers from Colorado College Tiger Travel, National Trust Tours, Harvard Alumni Travels, Cornell's Adult University, and the Archaeological Institute of America.
